## *Mission Update*

As school resumes here in the Pacific Northwest, the kids of Child Empowerment Outreach are returning to school as well. However, their return to school is not because of summer vacation but instead because political unrest is finally beginning to calm.

In August of this year, Kenya held an election for a new President. Just prior to the announcement of the new President-elect, “four of the nation’s seven electoral commissioners held a separate briefing to announce that they didn’t accept the result.” (Bloomberg) Shots rang out as supporters of the losing candidate rushed the podium and stopped the announcement. This began a difficult season of fighting, riots and street protests in Kenya.

Travel has been difficult for our CEO:Mission team but they are doing what they can to stay in contact with our kids and provide assistance. Please keep them in prayer. Finally, the kids are returning to school, businesses are re-opening and tensions seem to be settling down. We are hopeful that CEO:Mission staff can soon return to the work of helping our kids.

The building pictured below shows the progress on the shed, which now has the walls completed, windows and a door installed. The structure can be secured so that supplies may be kept inside and our caretaker is able to stay on the property for security. We are celebrating every victory and every step forward.



As the work continues, the next phase will be a retaining wall that will serve as a property line and exterior wall of the complex. Even though heavy rains have brought delays, the foundation has been dug and the first stones are already going down.
